**Special Note:**

**Fruit destined to Argentina but entering/transiting through Chile**

**Shipper:**

- Fruit must meet the export requirements of both countries.
- List **both Argentina/Chile** in the block titled "TO: THE PLANT PROTECTION ORGANIZATION(S) OF".
- List Argentina as the country in block 8 (DECLARED NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE CONSIGNEE).
- Write the Additional Declarations for EACH country SEPARATELY (in quotation marks) in the AD box (you may have to use an attachment).

**ACOs:**

- Scan or fax a copy of the FPC to your ECS as soon as possible so that it can be forwarded to Export Services.
- Export Services will then forward the FPC to the plant protection officials in Chile so as to explain the situation with them to avoid any confusion (re: delays).

Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate Required. **DO NOT CERTIFY UNLESS AN IMPORT PERMIT IS PRESENTED.**

Must be free of *Clavibacter michiganensis* spp. *Insidiosus*.

*Clavibacter michiganensis* spp. *Insidiosus* is alfalfa bacterial wilt, *Euphorbia esula* is Leafy spurge, and *Orobanche* spp. is broom rape.

Growing season inspections required.

**AD Required:**

“The seed in this shipment is free of CLAVIBACTER MICHIGANENSIS SPP. INSIDIOSUS, EUPHORBIA ESULA, and OROBANCHE SPP. Based on field inspections during the active growth of the mother plants.”

**AD Required:**

“Shipment is free from TROGODERMA SPP. TROGODERMA GRANARIUM is not known to occur in the United States.”

- **in-shell almonds and pistachios**

Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate Required. **DO NOT CERTIFY UNLESS AN IMPORT PERMIT IS PRESENTED.**

RESTRICTIONS - Prohibited

**SUMMARY INFO** – Fruit from San Bernardino county is not allowed. Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate Required. **DO NOT CERTIFY UNLESS AN IMPORT PERMIT IS PRESENTED.** County where grown must be recorded on Phyto. The shipment must be free of leaves.

The fruit must be free from *Conotrachelus nenuphar* (Plum curculio), *Cydia packardi* (Cherry fruit worm), *Cydia prunivora* (lesser apple worm), and *Erwinia amylovora* (fire blight). The fruit must originate from an area free of *Rhagoletis pomonella* (apple maggot) and exotic fruit flies OR the fruit must be treated with a cold treatment: either 40 days at 0 degrees F, 55 days at 2.2 deg. F, or 90 days at 3.3 deg. F. Treatment must be recorded on Phyto.

**\*For pears only** - The fruit must be held in a solution of 100 ppm chlorine for not less than one minute. At the beginning of the pack-out the certifying official must be present when the chlorine concentration is determined. The chlorine concentration levels must be monitored by packing house personnel during pack-out and the 100 ppm chlorine concentration level maintained.

**AD Required (both apples and pears):**

“The shipment is free of CONOTRACHELUS NEUPHAR. The shipment has been inspected and found free of CYDIA PACKARDI and CYDIA PRUNIVORA. The shipment comes from an area outside quarantine regulated area for fruit flies. The shipment is free of leaves. The fruit has been treated with (enter either benzalkonium chloride or sodium hypochlorite or chlorine dioxide) and is free of ERWINIA AMYLOVORA.”

**AND**

“The shipment comes from an area free of RHAGOLETIS POMONELLA.”

**OR**

“The shipment has been cold treated for RHAGOLETIS POMONELLA.”

**SUMMARY INFO** - Fruit is Prohibited from San Bernardino county.

Import permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate Required. **DO NOT CERTIFY UNLESS AN IMPORT PERMIT IS PRESENTED.** The California county where fruit was grown must be recorded on the PC.

The shipment must be free of *Anarsia lineatella* (peach twig borer), *Conotrachelus nenuphar* (plum curculio), *Cydia packardii* (cherry fruit worm) and *C. prunivora* (lesser apple worm). The shipment must originate from an area free of *Rhagoletis pomonella* (apple maggot), *R. cingulata* (cherry fruit fly), *R. indifferens* (western cherry fruit fly), and exotic fruit flies. Apricots and plums must also be free of *R. fausta* (cherry fruit fly).

**AD Required:**

“The shipment is free of ANARSIA LINEATELLA, CONOTRACHELUS NENUPHAR, CYDIA PACKARDI, and CYDIA PRUNIVORA. The shipment originates from an area free of RHAGOLETIS POMONELLA, RHAGOLETIS CINGULATA, and RHAGOLETIS INDIFFERENS.” **(for plums and apricots add RHAGOLETIS FAUSTA to AD pest list)**

**ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR PEACHES AND NECTARINES -**

In addition to the requirements listed above:

For fruit harvested **BEFORE** August 30 and originating from the counties of Kern, Fresno, Madera, Merced, or Tulare – The above requirements are sufficient.

For fruit harvested **AFTER** August 30 and NOT coming from the above counties

-Methyl bromide fumigation required at the rate of 40g/m<sup>3</sup> @ >21 C and must also be found to be free of *Rhagoletis completa* (walnut husk fly) and the first sentence of the AD should be:

“The shipment is free of ANARSIA LINEATELLA, CONOTRACHELUS NENUPHAR, CYDIA PACKARDI, CYDIA PRUNIVORA, and RHAGOLETIS COMPLETA.”

**SUMMARY INFO -**

Only lemons are allowed from San Bernardino County.

**Oranges, Grapefruit, Tangerines –**

Import Permit and Federal or State Phytosanitary Certificate Required. **DO NOT CERTIFY UNLESS AN IMPORT PERMIT IS PRESENTED.**

Must be free of *Brevipalpus lewisi* (citrus flat mite), *Brevipalpus californicus* (scarlet tea mite), *Maconellicoccus hirsutus* (pink hibiscus mealybug), and come from areas free of exotic fruit flies.

**AD Required:**

“This shipment was produced in an area outside quarantine regulated area for fruit flies. This shipment has been inspected and found free from BREVIPALPUS LEWISI, BREVIPALPUS CALIFORNICUS, and MACONELLYCOCCUS HIRSUTUS.”

**Lemons –**

Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate Required. **DO NOT CERTIFY UNLESS AN IMPORT PERMIT IS PRESENTED.**

**AD Required:**

“This shipment has been inspected and found free of BREVIPALPUS LEWISI and BREVIPALPUS CALIFORNICUS and MACONELLYCOCCUS HIRSUTUS.”

**SUBSIDIARY INFO -**

Phyto inspections must take place no more than 30 days prior to shipping.

Fruits and vegetables are prohibited from San Bernardino County. California county where grown must be listed on Phyto

Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate Required. **DO NOT CERTIFY UNLESS AN IMPORT PERMIT IS PRESENTED.**

**All Fruit and Vegetables NOT listed below:**

**AD Required:**

“This shipment was produced in an area outside quarantine regulated area for fruit flies.”

**Grapes** – Must be free from *Brevipalpus lewisi*, *B. californicus*, *Thrips palmi*, *Otiorynchus sulcatus* (vine weevil), and *Tetranychus pacificus* (Pacific spider mite) and come from areas free of exotic fruit flies.

**AD Required:**

“This shipment was produced in an area outside quarantine regulated area for fruit flies. This shipment is free from BREVIPALPUS LEWISI, BREVIPALPUS CALIFORNICUS, OTIORHYNCHUS SULCATUS, THRIPS PALMI, and TETRANYCHUS PACIFICUS.”

**Peppers** – Must be free from *Liriomyza trifolii* (American serpentine leafminer) and *Thrips palmi* and come from areas free of exotic fruit flies.

**AD Required:**

“This shipment was produced in an area outside quarantine regulated area for fruit flies. This shipment is free from LIRIOMYZA TRIFOLII and THRIPS PALMI.”

**SUBSIDIARY INFO -**

Phyto inspections must take place no more than 30 days prior to shipping.
