GRAPES TO UNITED KINGDOM – There is a voluntary, SO₂/CO₂ verification, systems approach, program, for the control of black widow spiders, available for exporters to participate in during this shipping season. The California Table Grape Commission is responsible for coordinating this program. Exporters must register with this association and complete a compliance agreement. Compliance agreement procedures must be followed by the shipper. Shippers must have a tracking system and security system in place for all grapes in this program. All packaging shall be new Plastic, Styrofoam, or TKV type. Cardboard material shall not be used.

A treatment with 1% SO₂ & 6% CO₂ for 30 minutes is required. The pallets must have an SO₂/CO₂ treatment tag placed on them after treatment is completed. The treatment tag should have “treated with SO₂/CO₂” written on it, and treatment no. and treatment date.

County personnel will review the logbook, treatment tags, & tracking procedures and will indicate compliance with the agreement by officially stamping each treatment tag, at the time of loading of the product into shipping containers. ACOs should complete a shed inspection report with name of facility, number of pallets/cartons, labels, import country, billing information, name & call number. Turn in to main office. Complete a 2% phyto inspection & leave the treatment section of the phyto blank. NOTE: All that is needed to confirm SO₂/CO₂ treatment for this program, is that the treatment tags have been officially stamped by the County personnel.

Bareroot roses and Canna bulbs - Federal Phytosanitary Certificate required. Plants must be free from non-European populations of *Bemisia tabaci*, *Thrips palmi*, bean golden mosaic virus, *cowpea mild mottle virus, lettuce infectious yellow virus, pepper mild tigré virus, squash leaf curl virus and other viruses transmitted by *Bemisia tabaci*. Plants must also be free of any other vectors that transmit the previous diseases. The plants must be dormant and are free from flowers, leaves, and fruit.

The plants must be treated for *Bemisia tabaci* (sweet potato whitefly) before shipment and the treatment documented on the phyto (which means it must be witnessed by an inspector).

AD Required: “The plants were grown in a nursery. The plants are clean and free from plant debris, flowers, and fruits. The plants are dormant and free from leaves. The plants were inspected at appropriate times prior to export and found free from symptoms of bacteria, viruses, and virus-like organisms. The plants originate from an area free from *Thrips palmi*. No symptoms of Bean golden mosaic virus, lettuce infectious yellow virus, pepper mild tigré virus, squash leaf curl virus and other viruses transmitted by *Bemisia tabaci* were observed on the plants during an adequate period. Cowpea mild mottle virus is not known to occur in the US. The plants were treated for *Bemisia tabaci*.”

AND either:

“The plants were found free from signs or symptoms of harmful nematodes, insects, mites, and fungi.”

OR:

“The plants were treated to eliminate nematodes, insects, mites, and fungi.”

Plants with roots & grown outside (not in a greenhouse):

Must be free from *Clavibacter michiganensis* spp. *Sependoniscus*, **Globodera pallida*, *Globodera rostochiensis* and **Synchytrium endobioticum*.

Use above AD required and also:

“The place of production is free from *Clavibacter michiganensis* spp. *Sependoniscus* and *Globodera rostochiensis*.”; “*Globodera pallida* and *Synchytrium endobioticum* are not known to occur in the US.”

Federal Phytosanitary Certificate required. Must be free from BEMISIA TABACI.

AD Required: “Immediately prior to export the cut flowers were inspected and found free from BEMISIA TABACI.”

Soil and Growing Medium –

Soil and growing medium which consists in whole or in part of soil or solid organic substances such as part of soil or solid organic substances such as parts of plants, humus including peat or bark, other than that composed entirely of peat is prohibited from USA (except Florida participants in a special certification program).
