AD Required:

“The plants in this shipment were inspected and found apparently free of plant pests.”

The certificate must bear the name of the state, territory, district, or country where the material was cultivated; the name and address of the consignee and importer and the accepted common name or scientific name of the plant being shipped. The material must meet all applicable federal quarantines.

All fruits and vegetables must be free from plants, plant parts, or other foreign material (sand, soil, etc.).

Vegetables must be free from vegetable weevils. All fruit must be free from Medfly and other pests.

All shipments are subject to inspection upon arrival.

Plants must be free from Rosa mosaic virus, Tobacco etch virus, Tobacco mosaic virus, and Bean Golden mosaic virus.

All plants and/or propagative material must be free from sand, soil, earth, and other foreign material and must be accompanied by an inspection certificate issued by the authorities at origin.

All shipments are subject to inspection upon arrival.
