Applications should include the name and quantity of the material; destination and locality where the material will be used; the country of export; estimated date of arrival; port of entry, including the entry and exit ports for plants and plant products in transit.

If no Import permit is presented and the city is not known, enter "Russia."

### FRUITS –

Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate required. Citrus must be free from Medfly, Apples must be free from apple maggot, and all fruit must be free from Oriental fruit moth.

### VEGETABLES –

Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate required. Must be free from pests and soil. Shipments must enter through authorized ports that are identified on the Import Permit. Special conditions stated in the Import Permit may apply.

#### **AD Required:**

With Import Permit: "Import permit number \_\_\_\_ was presented."

Without Import Permit: "No Import permit was presented."

Please note that *Trogoderma spp.* are Khapra beetle insects and other species of *Trogoderma* beetles. Khapra beetle is not known to occur in Kern County. *S. litura* is Asian cutworm and *S. littoralis* is Egyptian cottonworm. These two insects are not known to occur in the United States.

#### SEED –

Import Permit and Federal Phytosanitary Certificate required.

Soil is prohibited.

Each consignment of ware potatoes shall be free from soil and plant debris. The product will be delivered in new boxes or new sacks (including 1-ton totes) which indicate their content and origin of consignment. The wooden packaging material shall be compliant with International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures ISPM № 15

**Additional Declaration:** “This shipment of ware potatoes has been inspected and found free from *Epitrix cucumeris*, *Epitrix tuberis*, *Phthorimaea operculella*, *Meloidogyne chitwoodi*, *Globodera rostochiensis*”

### **Tubers for Propagation:**

Tubers for propagation are prohibited. **DO NOT** certify unless an import permit (IP) is presented.

Shipment must enter through authorized ports that are identified on the Import Permit. Special conditions stated in the Import Permit may apply.

Must be free from pests & soil. Some pests of concern are: *Bemisia tabaci* (Sweet potato whitefly), *Quadraspidiotus perniciosus* (San Jose scale), *Thrips palmi*, *Frankliniella occidentalis* (Western flower thrips), *Hyphantria cunea* (Fall webworm) & *Liriomyra trifolii* (Serpentine leafminer).
