FARM LABOR CONTRACTOR REGISTRATION AND RESPONSIBILITIES TO EMPLOYEES

1. Every farm labor contractor licensed in the State of California to perform various functions and duties is required to:
 - a. Register annually with the Agricultural Commissioner of the county or counties in which the labor contractor has contracted with a grower;
 - b. Carry his or her license and proof of registration with him or her at all times;
 - c. File with the Agricultural Commissioner of the county or counties in which the labor contractor has contracted with a grower, a correct change of address immediately upon each occasion the licensee permanently moves his or her address.
2. A civil penalty of not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for each violation may be levied against a person for violating Section 1695 of the Labor Code, which pertains to registration with the Agricultural Commissioner, carrying proof of that registration, and filing changes of address with the Agricultural Commissioner; or Division 7, Chapter 2, Article 10.5 of the California Food and Agriculture Code pertaining to pesticide and Worker Safety.
3. The State of California requires the safety of employees that may enter a field when exposure to a pesticide or its residue can be reasonably expected.
4. The employer shall assure that each employee assigned to work in a *treated field is trained annually, in a manner the employee understands, and before beginning work in the treated field. The training must be in accordance with the California Code of Regulations section 6764.
5. The training shall be conducted by a qualified trainer.
6. There must be soap, single use towels, and at least one gallon of water per employee, for the washing of hands and face and for emergency eye flushing. These decontamination facilities shall be not more than 1/4 mile from the fieldworkers (or at the nearest point of vehicular access).

7. When a farm labor contractor receives notice of a pesticide application from the operator of the property, he/she shall give notice to his or her employees.

8. Employees or their supervisors shall be informed of where to go to receive emergency medical treatment.
 - a. They shall be informed of the NAME, ADDRESS and TELEPHONE NUMBER of a doctor, hospital, clinic or emergency room where employees can receive medical treatment.
 - b. If it is not convenient to go to the designated location, procedures to take the employees elsewhere are required.

9. When it is suspected that an employee is ill due to a pesticide or when exposure to a pesticide has occurred that could result in illness of the employee, the employee must be taken to a doctor immediately.

10. Whenever employees work in a *treated field, the employer shall display at the worksite, all permanent decontamination facilities, and any decontamination facilities servicing 11 or more fieldworkers, a copy of a completed written Hazard Communication Information for Employees Working in Fields (Pesticide Safety Information Series leaflet A-9).

*Treated field means a field that has been treated with a pesticide or had a restricted entry interval in effect within the last 30 days.
